Meet Niles Township Government

Our April 2008 Member of the Month

Congratulations to our April 2008 Member of the Month – Niles Township Government – 158 years and going strong!

America's oldest form of government, the Township, was created by the Illinois Constitution of 1848. The first Townships in Illinois were formed in 1849, and today 85 of Illinois' 102 counties operate under the township system. Statewide, the 1,433 Townships serve more than 8 million people.

Township government in America dates back to the Pilgrims. They came to the New World in search of political freedom, and created the purest form of democracy – the Township.

Township government today operates under the same principle of democratic rule as it did 158 years ago. The first townships established the town meeting as the cornerstone of citizen participation, and today, Niles Township has a town meeting each April to allow citizens direct input into the governing process.

Niles Township continues to provide general and emergency assistance, computer classes, food distribution, a childcare center, and assessor's and clerk's offices, and also gives grants to a vast array of organizations that heal, enrich, and delight its residents.

Niles Township provides assistance through its financial support of Turning Point and Metropolitan Family Services, which offer mental health and counseling programs for adults and children.

In addition, Niles Township supports many organizations and programs providing services for people with disabilities. These include: Center for Enriched Living, Glenkirk, Presbyterian Homes (Great Opportunities), Maine-Niles Association of Special Recreation, Thresholds Transitions (formerly Niles Township Sheltered Workshop), Orchard Village, Resources for Community Living, Misericordia Home, Rimland Services, Shore Community Services, and Visions (formerly Blare House).

The Township also supports human/health care services that are provided by: A Safe Place, Ark, BEHIV, Cancer Wellness Center, Response Center, Interfaith Housing, Suburban Primary Health Care (Access to Care), Midwest Palliative Care, Northwest CASA, Willpower and Wings.

Support also goes to cultural and community services: Centre East, Cavalcade of Music Foundation, Grassfield Writers, Morton Grove Days Parade, Skokie Community Chorus, Skokie 4th of July Parade, Skokie Sculpture Park, Skokie Valley Symphony, Indo-American Center, and New American Conversation Club.

Grants for seniors go to: Lincolnwood Subsidized Taxi Program, North Shore Senior Center and senior clubs in Skokie, Lincolnwood, Niles and Morton Grove.

Youth support services include: Camp Red Leaf, Children's Advocacy Center, Response Center, The Harbour, Links, Niles Township Community Childcare Center, and S.O.C.K.S.

Message from Chamber President, Dale Ashcraft

Dear Morton Grove Chamber of Commerce and Industry Members,

After being installed on January 31, I'm happy to report that your 2008 Board of Directors went into action, demonstrating a great deal of commitment for the activities, which will add value to MGCCI membership in 2008.

Essentially, these activities fall into two categories:

- To be a conduit for two-way communication between local businesses and government bodies, both as an advocate for businesses and for civic programs, which benefit businesses.
- To provide more opportunities for member businesses to establish new relationships and reach more prospective clients and customers.

The process has already started. Here are a few of the new initiatives for 2008:

The MGCCI is working closely with various Village departments to coordinate civic events with promotional opportunities for businesses. For example, this year's Morton Grove Days will include a Business-to-Consumer Expo for Chamber members.

In 2007, MGCCI participated with other Illinois Chambers to block the Blagojevich business tax. We stay in contact with Bill Neuendorf, Community & Economic Development Director, regarding Village decisions, which impact Morton Grove businesses. One

program, currently under development, will assist businesses with signage and storefront improvements.

The board's newly established Ambassador Program will further enhance the value of Chamber membership. Ambassadors will become mentors to members and prospective members, for the purposes of increasing attendance at Chamber functions, recruiting new members and providing a conduit between businesses and government.

Executive Director, Mark Pendergrass, has revamped our newsletter in order to provide more advertising space and reach more readers. While only members may advertise in this publication, circulation has been dramatically increased to include other businesses. As a result of these changes, the newsletter has become a more valuable advertising buy and a tool for recruiting new members.

The Community Guide will also feature a new format and increased circulation.

2008 has already seen an increase in membership and more multi-chamber networking events, with improved attendance. The result is more exposure for businesses, which participate in these events. Remember, people do business with people they know. Take advantage of your MGCCI membership and actively participate. You and your business will make new friends.

Magazine Memories

Maybe you've driven by the place a million times on your way east or west down Dempster. Maybe you've always wondered just exactly what it was or what was inside but you never stopped to find out. You've told yourself "I need to get in there some day and check it out."

Well, now is the time. Magazine Memories is a local treasure – unique to the Midwest, it's one of seven (I repeat: one of seven!) remaining vintage magazine stores in the entire U.S.A.

Chicago doesn't have a store like this, neither does New York, but we do. And it's been right under our collective nose, a Morton Grove gem, for over 18 years. With more than 100,000 magazines dating back to 1840 and over 40,000 posters, it's like a museum where you can actually buy the exhibits. Forget the Internet, if you're looking for back issues of Life, Time, Vogue, Sports, Mad, Motor Trend, Playboy, the Saturday Evening Post, Fortune, Esquire and so much more, then Magazine Memories probably has it on hand, right now.

If you're reading this, you may be wondering – why buy old magazines? One of the main reasons is for birthday or anniversary gifts – the day your mother was born or married, the day your dad went to the service for WWII, for Korea, for Vietnam, for the Gulf War – or the day he came home. Wonderfully warm memories come flooding back when people receive these gifts and see the old car ads, the old Coke ads or fashions of the day. Or maybe it was a political scandal that's ancient history now, but that marked a time in their lives.

The owner of Magazine Memories, Bob Katzman, started collecting magazines and old newspapers in 1963. He was 13 when he started, the day President Kennedy died, and for 45 years he's never stopped. His original store was in Chicago, but he needed more space so he moved to Morton Grove many years ago and has been here ever since.



Bob runs Magazine Memories the old fashioned way. He engages his customers individually, assists each customer personally, and knows the exact location of every single item in his store by memory alone – no computer needed for Bob Katzman.

We are very excited about Magazine Memories joining the Morton Grove Chamber, and we highly encourage you to give Magazine Memories a visit soon – for gifts for yourself,

your family, your loved ones, and those clients that seem to have everything. Special note about Magazine Memories: Bob's inventory are unknown TV and movie extras. Prop departments from local, national, and international television and film production companies call on Bob continually for his expertise and to find just the right poster or magazine for the scenes they're filming.

Most recently, the Chicago production team shooting Public Enemies, a movie about John Dillinger (and starring Johnny Depp), picked up a few things.
